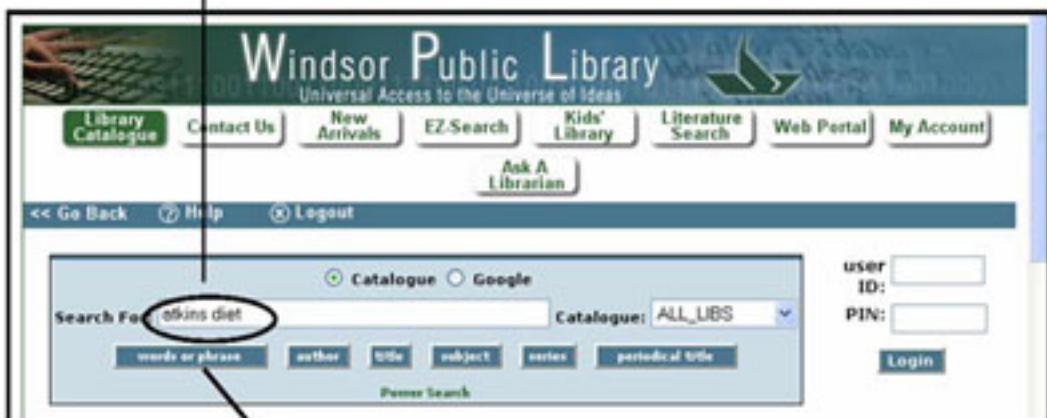


Searching by Keyword

- 1 Use keyword when you are unsure of the exact title, author, or subject. Suppose, for example, you are looking for a book you heard about—you think the book's author is someone named Atkins and he wrote something about a diet. Enter what you know in the search box. **Tip:** the more words you search for, the shorter and more specific your results will be.



- 2 Click on the “words or phrase” button.

- 3 Here are your search results. Click “Details” to learn about copy availability.
