

What is Labour Market Information?

Any job counselor will say that conducting labour market research is an important part of looking for work. Trend spotting enables the job hunter to discover which industries are likely to be hiring, where growing companies are located, and what types of skills will be in demand.

Labour market research provides a big picture of the employment situation.

- What broad economic trends are encouraging businesses to grow or cut back?
- Which industries or sectors are most affected?
- Within and across industries, what types of occupations are in demand and which are in decline?
- What are the average wages and salaries for specific occupations?

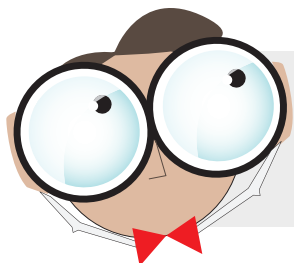
